The Plankinton City Council met in a special session on Monday, September 20, 2021, for the purpose of holding the 2nd reading of the Medical Cannabis Ordinance #2021-3. Mayor Staller called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Members present: Pam Vissia, Brad Kehn, Jim Hinckley, Jason Schurz and Terry Schuldt. MEDICAL CANNABIS ORDINANCE #2021-3:

This was to be the 2nd Reading & Adoption of the Medical Cannabis Ordinance #2021-3, but a Council member was approached with a necessary revision. Mayor Staller asked Councilman Kehn about the fact that he was asked about adding the south end of the Plankinton business district to the allowable area for Cannabis establishments. In talking to our city attorney, Jim Taylor, we should be fair, and since this substantially alters the substance of the ordinance from the first reading, the proposed ordinance as amended may not be considered for final adoption until at least 5 days after a duly noticed public meeting of the governing body, according to SDCL 9-19-17.1. The Council will have the ordinance re-written to include the south end of Main Street from Pennington Street to the south city limits, along, or within three hundred feet (300') of Main Street. They want to add that no residential properties can receive a medical cannabis license. The next reading will be held at the October 4, 2021, regular Council meeting.

POOL PLAYGROUND VANDALISM:

The Aurora County Sheriff's office reported that they have interviewed 2 juveniles regarding the damage done to the playground slides by dropping large cement blocks down them. The city is supposed to call the States Attorney regarding compensation for a new slide, plus employee time on the replacement procedure.

Mayor Staller adjourned the meeting at 6:30 p.m.
